Both institutions benefit from the cooperation.

Balance in numbers between incoming and outgoing mobility over a given period in time.

C

The mobility of an exchange student (for study and/or traineeship), who stays at a host institution for a period, during which she/he can carry out activities awarding academic credits, which are then recognised by the home institution (student receives at least 1 credit). This includes mobility in first, second and third cycle.

E

Project funded by budget for development of education. The best known example is the Erasmus+ programme.

Unique code that is assigned to institutions that are awarded the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) consisting of a reference to the country and city of the institution.

Student survey that all students participating in the Erasmus+ programme need to fill out in order to receive the last installment of their scholarship. An bilateral agreement where two institutions stipulate to exchange students and/or staff. There are agreements at institutional level, faculty level (Field of Education_broad) and programme level (Field of Education_detailed)

F

The ISCED fields of Education and training are used by UNESCO /Eurostat/ OECD to classify degrees into disciplines. A new classification was agreed upon in 2013 by UNESCO. The ISCED-2013 F classification comprises about 10 detailed fields of education (detailed level = four digits)
